

### CULTURA y GEOGRAFÍA

#### La Comida

South American food varies quite a bit, and many different indigenous influences contribute to the widely varying cuisines.

However, some of the foods that are commonly found in South America and thought to have originated there are:

- ◆ Corn (Maíz or Choclo) has been grown in South America for more than 5,000 years, and is South America's biggest food contribution to the rest of the world. Corn is the key ingredient of many staple dishes.
- ◆ The potato is another significant South American crop, and is found in many South American dishes, fried, mashed, baked and cooked in many other ways.

## ¡Qué chévere!

#### How cool!

- Brazil is the largest country in South America, but it happens to be a Portuguese-speaking country.
- ◆ La Paz, the capital of Bolivia, is the highest capital city in the world, situated almost 12,000 feet above sea level.
- ◆ The world's highest waterfall is Salto Ángel in Venezuela, at 3,212 feet or over twice the height of the Sears Tower in Chicago, and over 5 times the height of the Space Needle in Seattle.
- Machu Picchu is an Incan ruin in Peru, located 8,000 feet above sea level, and was built around 1460, and then abandoned about a 100 years later during the Spanish conquest.
